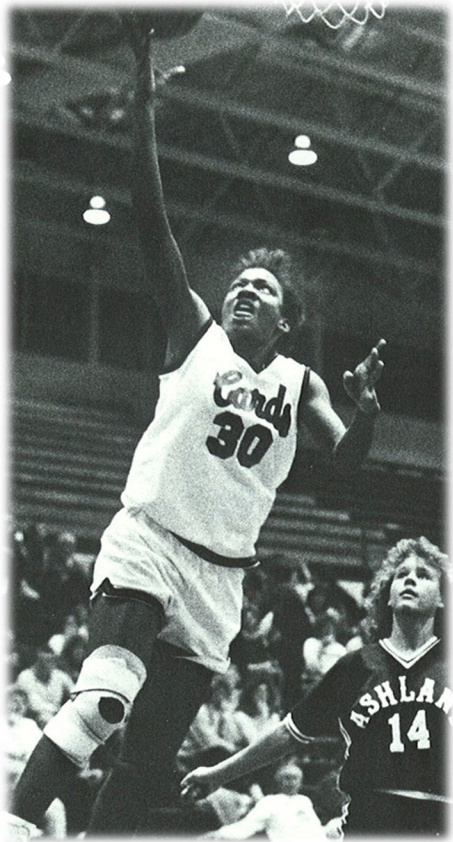

Clark falls in 'greatest' final

Clay County nips Lady Cardinals 48-44 in three overtimes for title

FRANKFORT, Ky. — Just minutes after the final buzzer sounded, it was being called the greatest girls' state championship game of all time.

Three overtime periods and a ton of suspense left a near-capacity crowd of 4,715 emotionally drained and physically exhausted.

However, it was a small consolation for George Rogers Clark. The Lady Cardinals had the state title in their grasp, only to let it slip away to the Clay County Tigerettes 48-44 Saturday night at the Farnham Dudgeon Civic Center here.

When it was all over, many tears were shed but there was little to say.

"It was an honor just to be here," Clark coach Lisa Goodin said. "This has got to be one of the greatest games ever played."

At the start of the post-game awards ceremonies, public address announcer Randy Mills asked the crowd to give a standing ovation for "this greatest of all state championship games."

To many, that was an understatement.

To the Lady Cardinals, however, it will be remembered as a game of missed opportunities.

The two teams were never separated by more than six points in the first half, but Clark rallied in the third period to take a nine-point advantage.

It was shortlived, though, as Clay compiled its own comeback and the Lady Cards needed a rebound basket by Lea Robinson with two seconds left in regulation to tie the game.

In the first overtime, two turnovers and a deliberate Clark offense prevented the Tigerettes from even getting off a shot. On the other end, Clark missed three free throws and a last-second field goal.

But there was another chance. In the second extra period, with no time on the clock and the Lady Cards down by one, Maisha Thomas swished the first of two free throws but the second bounced off.

But there was another chance. In the final overtime, Clay hit three clutch free throws in the final 24 seconds while Clark went 0-4 from the field.

It was finally over. "Even as a collegiate player, I have never been involved in a game of this caliber," said Goodin, the former Eastern Kentucky star. "We had every opportunity in the world to win, but it just wasn't meant to be."

It was the longest state tournament game in history and only the second championship match to go into overtime. Oldham County beat Franklin-Simpson 49-48 in one overtime in 1986.

Only six other state tourney games had ever gone past regulation and two of those needed two extra periods to decide.

"I'll probably re-live this game for I don't know how long," Goodin said. "There's not one specific thing that beat us."

Even though it was difficult at the time to put the entire season into perspective, Saturday's loss ended a year that was far more successful than anyone ever expected.

The Lady Cardinals went 29-4 last season and advanced to the quarterfinals of the state tourney with a senior-dominated squad.

This year, with four starters and five of the top six players having been lost to graduation, no one dreamed of even equalling last season's success.

But Clark went 29-3 and made it farther than any Lady Cardinals team had since girls' play was revived in 1975. And with only three seniors on the roster and an undefeated junior varsity team, the future looks bright.

"For most of the kids, this was the first big, big-time game they had been involved in," Goodin said. "They held their composure. Even though they were beaten, they were not defeated in my eyes."

The rest of Clark County must have felt the same way as more than 100 cars and a host of city and county officials greeted the team for an impromptu parade when it arrived back in Winchester Saturday night.

Few fans had gone home even though it was well after midnight and Easter sunrise services were only hours away.

For Clay County, which had been overshadowed in the past by the success of the boys' team, it was the girls' first state championship as they finished 31-3.

"This is the second-greatest feeling in the world," Clay coach Donnie Gray said. "The greatest is my two young ones and my wife."

But this is once in a lifetime. I'm glad we got it."

Clark had edged Marshall County 45-44 on Saturday morning's semifinals, while Clay had knocked off No. 1 Louisville Manual 49-46 on a last-second shot to advance.

"I thought it was a great ball game this morning, but it doesn't compare to this," Gray said.

In the end, it came down to who could put the ball in the basket.

Clark shot 50 percent from the field and made 4 of 6 free throws during regulation. In the three overtimes, however, the Lady Cards were just 1 of 9 from the field and 4 of 9 from the line.

Clay hit only 42 percent during regulation, but was perfect on its only two shots during the overtime. The Tigerettes were 8 of 10 from the line in regulation and 6 of 13 afterwards.

The game started slow with both teams being very deliberate offensively and displaying a few jitters in the early going.

Tournament Most Valuable Player Kim Jones opened the scoring with a jumper 34 seconds into the action. Robinson followed with one of two free throws and Thomas canned a 15-footer for a 3-2 Clark lead.

Clay's Emily Smith then got her only bucket of the night to push Clay back on top, but Amy Wilson hit the second of two charity tosses and Tracy Wells added a short jumper from the left baseline for a 6-4 Clark margin.

Jones hit another shot and Susan Feltner got a pair of free throws to put Clay up 8-6 at the break. Two turnovers in the last minute of the game took away Clark's final scoring opportunities.

Thomas opened the second frame by connecting on both ends of the bonus to knot the score and Robinson hit a 10-footer off the right baseline for a 10-8 lead with 4:35 left in the half.

Jones produced another tie with two free throws, but Clark went back on top on a shot inside by Robinson.

Missed free throw put Lady Cards into final

FRANKFORT, Ky. — George Rogers Clark made it to the girls' state tournament finals on the strength of a last-second lucky break.

The Lady Cardinals soared to a 14-point third-quarter lead and were up by 11 at the start of the final frame, but perennial state power Marshall County would not die.

The Lady Marshalls stormed back, but missed the second of two free throws with the clock reading 0:01 and Clark came away with a 45-44 win Saturday morning at the Farnham Dudgeon Civic Center.

"We had a 10-point lead and got a little too comfortable," Clark coach Lisa Goodin said. "We were looking to take time off the clock, but at the end we forgot we were looking to score, too."

The Lady Cards jumped out to a 6-0 lead and led all the way, but Marshall got the first six points of the final period to set up the final tense minute of action.

Clark's very patient offense made three turnovers to open the quarter and didn't get off a shot until Lea Robinson connected with 3:37 to play.

It turned out to be the Lady Cardinals' only field goal attempt of the period.

"We were just passing the ball and not looking for the shot," Robinson said.

Senior guard Amy Wilson then added three free throws to make the Clark lead 43-37 with 1:34 remaining.

Alicia Sells answered with a pair of free throws and, after Marshall intercepted a pass against Clark's fast break, Tammie Watkins canned a short jumper to cut

the lead to two with 1:09 to play.

The Lady Cards couldn't get the ball across midcourt in the required 10 seconds on their ensuing possession, but the Lady Marshalls didn't capitalize.

Kristie Walker, who led Marshall with 13 points and 6 rebounds, missed a jumper in the lane. Rochelle Gadwell, who added 11 points, grabbed the rebound but could not connect on the follow shot.

"When it got down to five points, the momentum shifted to our side," Marshall coach Howard Beth said. "We had good execution, but the shots didn't fall."

Maisha Thomas drew a foul with 25 seconds remaining and swished both ends of the bonus to give Clark a 45-41 edge.

Walker answered to slice the margin to two points with 16 seconds to go and Robinson was sent to the line at the 0:07 mark to shoot the bonus.

Robinson's first attempt bounced astray and Marshall claimed the board. The ball went to Sells, who drove almost the length of the court straight to the basket.

Wilson tried to cut her off, but was a half-step too slow and garnered a blocking foul on the shot. "I'd much rather them step to the line with one second left than score a wide-open layup," Goodin said.

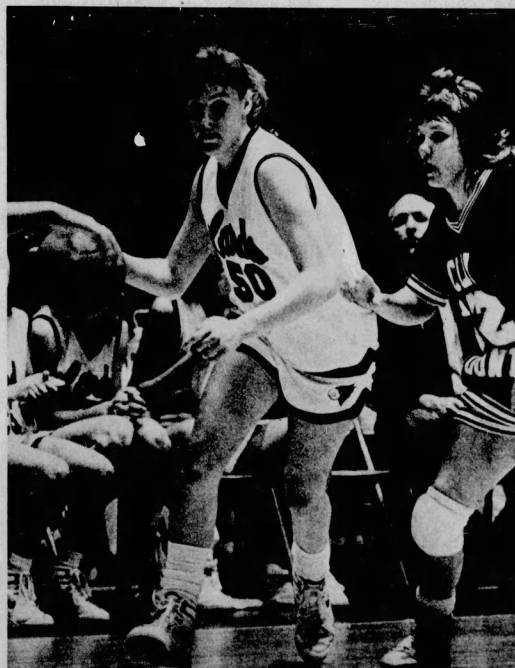
Sells' first shot was right on target.

"I told them if she hit both of them to secure the ball and throw it long," Goodin said. "If she missed, I told them to get the ball and bug it."

When Sells' second shot bounced off, Tracy Wells did just that. (See MISSED, S-4)

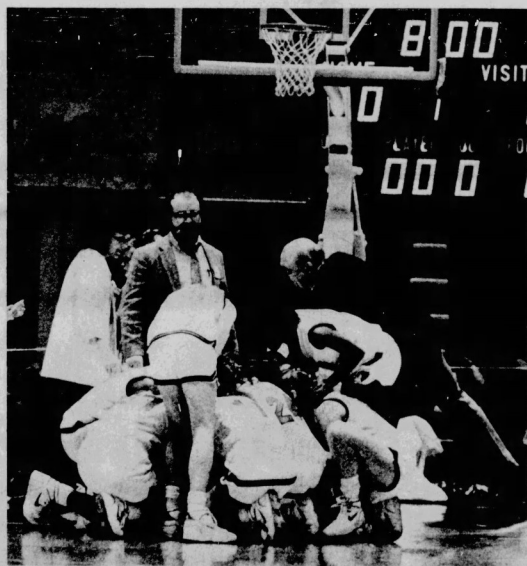
