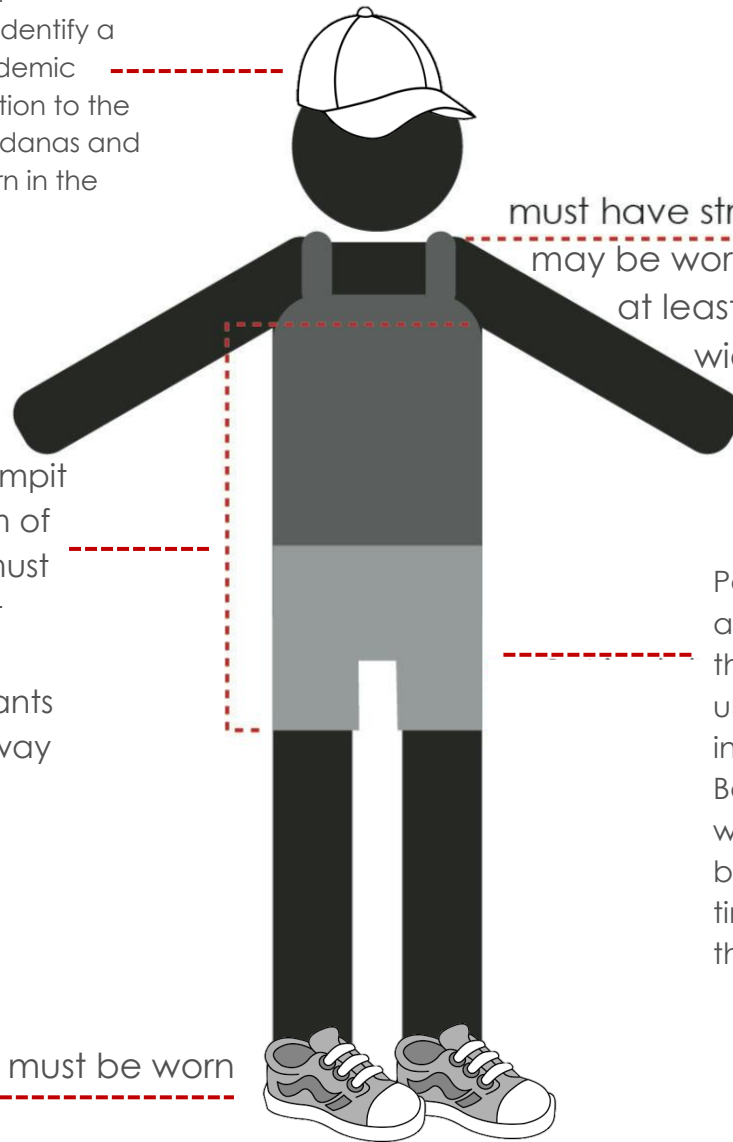


George Rogers Clark High School Dress Code Policy

Purpose

The purpose of the GRC dress code is to provide for a safe learning environment for all students while preparing students for postsecondary success.

Caps, hats, or head coverings may be worn provided they do not compromise the ability to identify a student, compromise academic integrity, or cause a disruption to the learning environment. Bandanas and sunglasses shall not be worn in the building.



must have straps – sleeveless shirts may be worn as long as the strap is at least 3 finger widths across in width. No shirt or blouse that exposes the chest or cleavage is allowed.

The entire area from armpit to armpit to the bottom of shorts (or equivalent) must be covered in the front and back. Shirts must touch the top of the pants (or equivalent) all the way around.

Pants/shorts must not sag and be worn above the hips, thereby revealing no underclothing or layers, including shorts or boxers. Bottoms must be worn in a way that private areas of the body are covered at all times, including genitals and the buttocks.

shoes must be worn

Extra Considerations:

- Costumes are not to be worn outside of approved designated costumes days.
- Long trench coats or blankets shall not be worn or carried in the building.
- Clothing or any item with questionable printing, obscenities, sexual innuendoes, offensive messaging, gang-related, weapons, or drug/alcohol or tobacco-related implications will not be permitted.

Possible Consequences:

- Change of clothes.
- Parent phone call home.
- Removal from class until the student is in dress code.
- Consequences will be assigned on a case by case basis as determined by the principal.
