

RECORDS OF SBDM PROCEEDINGS

Minutes for February 6, 2023

The George Rogers Clark High School SBDM council held a regular meeting on Monday, February 6, 2023, at 4:30 p.m. in the school library. The following were present:

Mr. Keene called the meeting to order at 4:31 p.m.

Mrs. Gay made a motion to approve the agenda. Mr. Collins wanted to add to the agenda. Mr. Keene said that it was too late to make changes. Mrs. Greenwell seconded the motion made by Mrs. Gay. Motion passed four to one.

Mr. Collins wanted to add to the minutes for the January 17th meeting. His additions were - Coy Hall, principal at ATC, favors more instructional time with seven periods. Terra Pigg, an agriculture teacher, is concerned that a six period schedule will cause students to lose electives and make it difficult to finish pathways. Mr. Collins made a motion to make these additions, second by Mr. Abner. Motion passed. Mr. Williamson made a motion to approve the minutes for January 17th, second by Mr. Abner. Motion passed four to one with one abstention.

There were parents, teachers and students at the meeting to discuss the schedule for next year. Attendees were given two minutes to present their preference. All attendees were in favor of a seven period schedule. Mr. Keene read three emails from teachers who prefer a six period schedule. Mr. Colling made a motion to stay the vote so that more students/parents

receive information. Mr. Keene told the council that since it was not on the agenda there could not be a vote.

Good news included several events. Mock Trial - teams placed 2nd and 3rd in regional competition. Both teams advance to state competition; 6 Students KMEA All-State Program (Anna Wilson - Orchestra; Hannah Platt, Charlee Wesley, Keenan Robinson, Joseph Booth, Phoenix Berryman - Choir); Anna Wilson won the CKYO Concerto Competition

Mrs. Bonfield gave an update on student achievement. The third round of iReady testing will be in April. She hoped to see some growth after this test. TSI interventions and MTSS are going well. Students seem to like MTSS. The next CSIP meeting will be this Friday morning. Goals will be discussed at that meeting.

Mr. Keene shared with the council that we are losing Title 1 funds. High schools no longer qualify. We have a little money left for the end of the year.

Attendance is down for this month. It is 90.7%. We have had a lot of illnesses.

Mrs. Gay made a motion to approve the Financial Report for December, second by Mr. Abner. Motion passed.

Mr. Williamson made a motion to approve all trips, second by Mr. Collins. Motion passed.

Mr. Keene has talked to Mr. Howard about allocations for next year. At next month's meeting, we will make exit decisions.

The Planning and Professional Development/Learning Committee reported to the council. Professional development will be offered to all teachers the four days before school starts in the fall. A group of administrators made a trip to Boyle County High School to observe their success with special needs students. Our staff was very impressed with their program.

The School Day and Week Schedule Policy is acknowledged at this time when we are helping the students to develop their schedule for next year. The principal will make recommendations concerning schedule changes for the coming school year no later than the end of February. He will prepare a master schedule by April 1st and notify the staff. No later than June 30th the principal will report as a FYI item to the council on the schedule for the coming year. This policy was adopted on November 21, 2021.

Mrs. Gay made a motion to adjourn, second by Mrs. Greenwell. Motion passed and council adjourned at 5:34 p.m.
