## Minutes for September 6, 2022

The George Rogers Clark High School SBDM council met on September 6, 2022, at 4:30 p.m. in the school library. The following were present:

Mr. Keene welcomed the council and called the meeting to order at 4:31 p.m.

Mrs. Greenwell made a motion to approve the agenda, second by Mr. Collins. Motion passed.

Mr. Abner made a motion to approve the minutes for the August 15th meeting, second by Mrs. Greenwell. Motion passed

Mr. Keene shared good news with the council that his daughter was married last weekend.

There were no public comments.

The iReady test will be given to students starting this week. The test is used for grades K-12 for an assessment of current levels. There are resources available for intervention up to the 10th grade.

The PLC data is both a formative and summative assessment. The information includes planning and instructional ideas that teachers can use for presentations.

The School Improvement Plan will include assessment diagnostics from August 1 to October 1, 2022. Mrs. Bonfield will need to have the CSIP to KDE by January 1, 2023.

Mr. Hall, principal for the vocational school, discussed adding medical math to the curriculum. Only seniors in the medical pathway can take this course. It will count as a fourth math or an elective; however, it cannot be used as a math credit and a CTE credit at the same time.

The staffing budget is due to the council on September 15th. The materials and supplies budget will be due the second month of school. Council discussed last year's expenditures for the departments. Mr. Keene had a dollar amount for purchases. The council wants him to bring a list of what was purchased last year to the October meeting.

Several sections of the Bylaw Policy were discussed and reviewed/revised. The following policies were reviewed/revised: Quorum, Open/Closed Session, Curriculum, Alignment with State Standards, Parent and Family Engagement, and Writing.

The SBDM should have five standing committees - Planning and Professional Development; Budget; Culture, Wellness and Resources; Curriculum, Instruction, and Technology; and Assessment of Students and Programs. Parents may be included in committees. Mr. Keene wants to reinstate the use of committees.

Mr. Keene updated the council members with KASC.

CSEPP exercises will be conducted on September 14th. There will be lots of activity, but it will only be a test for a chemical or gas spill.

The school will have an attendance day on September 14th. Students will be encouraged to improve their attendance. Several activities have been planned. Our attendance is usually 92%. If we can reach 95%, we would receive \$300,000 more federal money.

The General Fund Summary may show negative amounts in our budgets. However, the Board will move funds around at a later date to cover these expenses.

After viewing the July/August monthly finance reports, Mrs. Greenwell made a motion to approve both accounts, second by Mrs. Williamson, Motion passed.

Mr. Abner made a motion to approve the School Profile, second by Mr. Collins. Motion passed.

Mr. Williamson made a motion to adjourn the meeting, second by Mrs. Greenwell. Motion passed and council adjourned at 5:48 p.m.
