## Minutes for September 5, 2023

The George Rogers Clark High School SBDM council met on September 5, 2023, at 5:00 p.m. in the school library. The following were present:

Mr. Toy called the meeting to order at 5:02 p.m.

Council amended part of the agenda: number I, part C - Adoption of the Agenda should include marching band credit and Smoke Signal production credit.

Mr. Williamson made a motion to approve the agenda with the amendment, second by Mrs. Greenwell. Motion passed.

Mr. Williamson made a motion to approve the minutes of the August 30, 2023 meeting with the change of a typo from 4:00 a.m to 4:00 p.m; second by Mrs. Harper. Motion passed.

There were lots of Good News tonight:

- First staff meeting went very well.
- Teachers did a great job with new rules.
- New bell schedule went well.
- We only had 250 discipline referrals primarily phones and defiance.
- Smoke Signals made a video for students about the new parking changes which start on September 11th.

There were no public comments.

Mrs. Crosby requested that students taking Smoke Signals could use that as their art credit. A certified art teacher has to be in the room for this to happen. Mrs. Crosby works part of her day at the Board and needs to change Smoke Signal class to 6th and 7th period with Britney Fuller as the certified art teacher. Mr. Williamson made a motion that Smoke Signal students can use that credit as their art credit, second by Mrs. Harper. Motion passed.

Mr. Cook requested that marching band students use that credit as P.E. Mr. Williamson made a motion to approve the request to have marching band serve as a P.E. credit, second by Mrs. Greenwell. Motion passed.

Mrs. Gay made a motion to amend tardies to six per year. After six parent notes it goes to attendance and will need a doctor's note. Mrs. Harper seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Mr. Williamson made a motion to change all day absences from six to nine. After nine students will need a doctor's note. Mrs. Greenwell seconded the motion. Motion passed.

All members of the council had to sign the School Profile Report.

Council discussed the monthly budget. We are on track right now and have prepaid for things that we know are coming up such as graduation expenses. Mrs. Gay made a motion to approve the Monthly Budget, second by Mr. Williamson. Motion passed.

Mrs. Gay made a motion to approve all trips, second by Mr. Williamson. Motion passed.

Then there is Graduating Early which is for seniors to graduate before Christmas of their senior year. Lastly, there is Hardship Graduation for students who are dealing with hardships in their lives. All students who graduate early must take four English and math credits. Mr. Williamson made a motion to approve the removal of hardship graduation from the related procedures section of the Early Graduation policy, second by Mrs. Harper. Motion passed.

Mr. Gay made a motion to adjourn, second by Mrs. Harper. Motion passed and council adjourned at 6:07 p.m.
