Minutes for August 15, 2022

The George Rogers Clark High School SBDM council met on August 15, 2022, at 4:00 p.m. in the school library. The following were present:

Mr. Keene called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. He welcome everyone with Mr. Collins, Mrs. Gay and Mr. Williamson who are new to the council.

Mr. Abner made a motion to approve the agenda, second by Mrs. Greenwell.
Motion passed

Mrs. Greenwell made a motion to approve the minutes for the May 5th meeting, second by Mr. Williamson. Motion passed.

Mr. Keene announced the good news was our opening day. He was very pleased with how the faculty conducted the day.

There were no public comments.

SBDM meeting will include the following norms - consistent message for all stakeholders who are part of the team; feel safe to speak, share ideas, ask questions; and feel respected, appreciated and valued.

With a motion from Mr. Wiliamson, seconded by Mr. Abner, motion passed and Mrs. Greenwell will be Vice Chair for this year.

The council will continue to meet on the first Monday of each month at 4:30 p.m. with the exception of September and January which will meet on Tuesday.

Student Achievement will include several programs. This will include Torch Prep during school hours, senior readiness for college reading, English, and math; and the ALEKS test for college ready. AP/ACT results are up since the COVID years. Fourteen students will be going to BCTC for college classes and dual credits with Morehead State University will be in our building.

School By-Laws still need a writing policy which will be determined this year. Mr. Abner made a motion to approve the Emergency Management Plan, second by Mrs. Greenwell. Motion passed.

Mr. Keene discussed the Budget Report with the council. We are in the second year of receiving ESSER money-a three year program. We are receiving a little more this year. It is being used for the intervention and sub-teachers salaries. During the year the council will receive a monthly MUNIS statement. Title 1 money has been cut \$60,000 this year. Most high schools do not receive Title 1 money. We use this money for five full-time teachers's salaries. We will have to cut back next year without these funds.

Council discussed Section 6 money which purchases supplies and materials by departments went from \$100,000 to \$146,000. Mr. Williamson would like a list of purchases in the past. Mr. Keene will have those available for the next meeting.

On September 14th we will conduct a Chemical Stockpile Simulation.

Assessments this year will include i-Ready for 10th graders, PSAT in September, ACT in October for 10th and 11th graders. Future tests will be Alternate Assessment, Access, COGAT, KSA, KYOTE, ASVAB, Industry Certifications and APExams. Dates and students testing will be announced at a later date.

The first open house for the year will be August 18th, from 5:00 to 7:00 pm. Parents and guardians will receive a copy of their students schedule to talk to teachers and see what a normal day is for their student.

Two out-of-town, overnight trips were presented to the council:

- FFA to State Leadership Conference - September 9-10
- FFA to National FFA Conference - October 26-29

Mrs. Gay made a motion to approve both trips, second by Mrs. Greenwell. Motion passed.

Mr. Abner made a motion to adjourn, second by Mr. Collins. Motion passed and council adjourned at 5:15 p.m.
